

Miss Redwine's obituary:

PIONEER NURSE'S FUNERAL TODAY

Rites for Miss Edith Redwine,

62, to Be Conducted at

Monroe.

Monroe May 13. — Funeral services for Miss Edith Redwine, 62, pioneer nursing instructor, will be held at the Redwine home here Sunday afternoon at 2 o'clock. Dr. C. C. Weaver of Charlotte, will be in charge, assisted by Rev. M. J. Murray of Banner Elk, and Rev. Gilbert R. Combs of Monroe. Interment will be in the Monroe cemetery.

Miss Redwine died Friday morning in Grace Hospital, at Banner Elk, where she had been instructor of nurses for the last six years. She is survived by three sisters, Misses Mary and Ruth Redwine of Monroe and Miss Annie Redwine, teacher in the Greenville. N. C. schools.

Miss Redwine had been either the superintendent of hospitals or nurses instructor for many years. She was one of the first five nurses in North Carolina to receive her license, and took her training at St. Peter's hospital in Charlotte. She was the first registered nurse on the faculty of N.C. C. W. at Greensboro and was the first inspector of training schools for nurses in this state.

She was later educational director of training schools in this state and was a member of the board of examiners for nurses for many years. She had held many offices in the N.C. Nurses' association. Her last office being that of vice president. She had also been chairman of practically all the standing committees of the association and took an active part in its affairs.

She was instrumental in the establishment of several hospitals in the state and had been connected with many in an executive capacity. At the time of her death she held membership in the N.C. State Nurses' association, the St. Peter's Alumni association, Asheville district of N.C. Nurses, American Nurses' association, League of Nursing Education, and the American Red Cross Nursing service.
