

Late 19th Century Hospitals in NC

Early Permanent Hospitals in NC opened in the 19th century (not early Marine Hospitals, Civil War Hospitals or Reconstruction Hospitals)

1856	Dix	Raleigh	psychiatric	
1875	Mountain Sanitarium for Pulmonary Disease	Asheville	TB Sanitarium	Thought to be the first Sanitarium in US
1876	St. Peters	Charlotte	General	Episcopal
1878	St. Johns	Raleigh	General	Episcopal
1880	Cherry	Goldsboro	Psychiatric	Opened as NC Asylum for the Colored Insane
1881	City Hospital	Wilmington	General	Bought and became James Walker Memorial Hospital in 1901
1883	Broughton	Morganton	Psychiatric	Opened as Western Hospital for the Insane (or something like that)
1885	Mission Memorial	Asheville	General	Founded by an ecumenical, local women's group "Asheville Flower Mission"
1888	Winyah Sanitarium	Asheville	TB	
1887	City Memorial	W-S	General	Started by a group of local women
1891	Henry Long	Iredell Co	Surgical	Started by a doctor
1891	Good Samaritan	Charlotte	General	First Hospital for African American's in NC
1891-1897	Kings Daughters Hosp	Greensboro	General	Started by the Greensboro Chapter of the national Order of Kings daughters
1894	Rex	Raleigh	General	Rex trustees bought St Johns in 1893, then added a "Negro wing" and opened the hospital as Rex 1894 – Open Rex Hospital School for Nurses – first organized school of nursing in NC 1896 – A Children's wing was added – first Pediatrics hospital care in NC
1895	Watts	Durham	General	A School of Nursing was incorporated at the same time as the hospital. Longest running school of nursing in NC
1895	St. Josephs	Asheville	General. Later added a TB wing	First Catholic Hospital in NC run by Sisters of Mercy
1896	St. Agnes	Raleigh	General	Opened with the first nursing school for African Americans in NC Associated with St. Augustines an Episcopal College

1896	Wilson Sanitarium	Wilson	General	Was a general hospital not a sanitorium Opened by 2 doctors Nursing school started in 1890s but incorporated in 1902
1897	Pickford Sanitarium for Consumptive Negroes	Southern Pines	TB	A national hospital for African Americans with TB http://docsouth.unc.edu/nc/scruggs/scruggs.html
1899	Marsh - Highsmith Hospital	Fayetteville	General	Opened with a school of nursing Opened by 2 doctors
